*Diane Duncan became passionate about caring for the less fortunate during her 25 year aviation industry career. After witnessing extreme poverty in third world countries, Diane was disheartened to learn through local service agencies that there were individuals and families within our own community who were hungry and homeless, many of whom were sleeping in their cars or in tents during the coldest months of the year. Diane began helping homeless adult men and women through her volunteer efforts with The Salvation Army Reach Program in 2007. In 2015 she joined the Severe Weather Network Steering Committee and was named the Severe Weather Network Team Coordinator for the First Presbyterian Church of Brighton. In 2017 the Severe Weather Network Steering Committee unanimously voted to form the Severe Weather Network Livingston County, a non-profit organization. Diane was nominated and approved as the Severe Weather Network Chairperson. Diane attributes the great successes of the organization to a team of hard working, compassionate and dedicated board members, staff and volunteers who consistently serve and advocate for the least of their brethren as Christ has commanded.*
